

STUDENT PROGRESS REPORTS TO PARENTS

The Board believes that it is essential for parents to be kept fully informed of their children's progress in school. The type of progress reports sent to parents are devised by the professional staff in cooperation with parents.

Written report cards are provided to parents of children in grades one through 12, four times per year. Progress reports are sent to parents at the midpoint of each grading period, so that corrective steps can be taken to remedy deficiencies, or positive progress can be acknowledged. Supplementary, interim reports are also required for students in danger of failing. Direct notification of parents by telephone is encouraged. Conferences with parents are used as an integral part of the reporting system.

Progress reports shall also notify parents of incomplete course work and unexcused absences.
