### Notes about the telephone survey

- The telephone survey was only administered to the homes of CMSD students and families; 4,593 of the 30,711 homes reached responded to the survey (15%)
- The telephone survey was administered in English and Spanish
- The telephone survey did not allow for open-ended feedback (comments, questions, or suggestions)
- Some survey participants reported technical problems when attempting to complete the survey
- Some survey participants reported that the order of presentation of the items in the final section of the survey caused some confusion; based upon comparisons with other survey feedback (paper and online), the order of presentation did not appear to skew the survey results
