Whereas Cleveland Teachers Union (CTU) and Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) have made a commitment to eliminate the current academic disparity gap between CMSD students and the state of Ohio, as measured by the state average of the third graders on the Ohio Achievement Test in reading and math, the 2011 ESEA program will provide the opportunity for 1st and 2nd grade students most in need of a longer school year. As the focus is on increased instruction at those specific grade levels, CTU and CMSD agree that for the 2011 ESEA program, it is in the best interest of the students for the instruction be provided by teachers who taught grade one and grade two during the SY2010 and SY2011 school years. Students will participate in a field experience at the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo and classroom extended experience with Lake Farm Park.

To give selected students the opportunity to be promoted to high school by providing an engaging learning environment that fine tunes the academic and social skills necessary for a successful transition from 8th to 9th grade, encourages students to take ownership of their educational journey, and fosters a sense of self-awareness while building greater confidence in their ability to succeed.

Identification of Students:

8th grade students who are over age and not scheduled to be promoted to 9th grade

General Information:

- Students will be assigned by home schools based on non-promotion and overage status.
- **Students will not be notified of high school assignment until successful completion of summer school program.**
- Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C) -Metro Campus is again working with students in a weekly immersion project (trips to NASA Glenn, PowerPoint training, and exposure to Visual Arts and Media program) centered on Technology. Upon successful completion of all extended requirements, a student may earn **0.5 credits** in a technology elective.
- Students will work in small groups on a variety of projects as part of the six week experience with a main focus on social activism. The projects will be hands on, engaging and fun.
- Students will read and discuss the Bluford Series; this short story series will foster self-awareness and enhance literacy skills. The books are set in fictional Bluford High, a tough but nurturing inner-city high school in Los Angeles. Written to engage reluctant or underperforming readers, the novels speak to the interests, struggles, and concerns of today's 6th-10th graders.
- The Closing the Achievement Gap program will be a vital part of the summer academy experience. The Linkage Coordinators will lend support by providing the social-emotional component to the program.

General Information:

2011 SECONDARY SUMMER SCHOOL (SSS)

Whereas CTU and CMSD have made a commitment to provide students with early intervention and opportunities to make-up credit in core academics for grades 9-11 and any academic content area(s) for grade 12 through traditional credit recovery course work or an on-line credit recovery classroom. Each academic make-up class is 150 minutes in length, and completion of the full 23-day course will equal one semester credit make-up. Students may register up to two semester credits.

Teacher lesson plans will reflect the District's summer school curriculum to meet the needs of students. The District has designed a series of Problem Based Learning (PBL's) to cross content areas. In addition, all high school sites will have an on-line credit recovery classroom(s).

Characteristics of summer PBL's are:

- Student learning is driven by challenging, open-ended problems.
- Students generally work in collaborative groups.
- Teachers take on the role as "facilitators" of learning.
- Students will be encouraged to take responsibility for their group and organize and direct the learning process with support from the instructor.
- PBL's will be used to enhance content knowledge while simultaneously fostering the development of communication, problem-solving, and self-directed learning skills, to re-engage students in learning.
